

The Feast of Christ, The King

When the great Cathedrals were being built in the Middle Ages most people were illiterate. The cathedrals told the story of the New and Old Testaments as well as the lives of Jesus, Mary and the saints. These were told in statues, paintings, tapestries and stained glass windows.

Most, if not all of those cathedrals were built in cruciform or the shape of a cross. Most, if not all were built because of a relic that was given to the city. For instance, Notre Dame in Paris, France was given the crown of thorns surrounding Jesus' head during the crucifixion.

Every cathedral of the Middle Ages has a Great Rose Window. Depicted in the Rose Window is Christ, The King. When a person learned his/her catechism by walking through the cathedral, leaving the cathedral would give them the image of Christ, The King, ruler over all creation.

After much review and a survey of the world's bishops, Pope Pius XI (1922-1939) instituted the Feast of Christ, The King, to respond to the growing nature of secularism and communism. In his encyclical: Quas Primas (In The First) the Pope recognized the fact that worldly allure would thrust Jesus Christ and His holy law out of public life, causing discord among people an nations.

Surely, during the 1920's Mexico and Russia launched direct attacks on the Church and its people. In some parts of Europe the same was taking place.

Pope Pius' encyclical produced many comforting phrases: "Jesus Christ is very truth, and it is from Him that the truth must be obediently received by all mankind," to quote just one.

The readings for this Sunday revolve around the theme of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. A shepherd who cares for the flock. A good King who feeds His people. Today the Psalm is most explicit: "The Lord rules me," instead of "The Lord is my Shepherd."

The Lord Jesus, as King of the heart, brings about interior transformation. Please, may all of us, clergy included, never believe that we can solve any crisis on our own as the Lord Jesus, as King, leads us beside still waters. All of our work must be informed by prayer. To that end we celebrate the Feast of Christ, The King.
