Anointing of The Sick

The common Catholic people referred, and in many instances still refer to the "anointing of the sick", in error, as the Last Rites. In 2025, Vatican Council II will be closed for 60 years. Since its closing in 1965 the Church has referred to this sacrament as the "anointing of the sick". It may surprise you to know that the official name, in those days, was extreme unction, not the "last rites". The people gave extreme unction the title "last rites".

Prior to Vatican II "Extreme Unction" could be administered to a person who had already passed. Witness the Dallas priest who administered Extreme Unction to President John F. Kennedy at Parkland Hospital in Dallas, Texas in 1963, hours after the president expired!

The anointing of the Sick has brought comfort and still continues to bring comfort to both the sick and the dying. Suffice it to say; There is no such sacrament as Last Rites, there never was! There is no more Extreme Unction either. One never existed and the other is gone from Catholic practice and speech.

What is the focus of the Anointing of The Sick? First of all it's Biblical we find it in James 5: 4-15. "Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters (priests) of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven. Secondly, it has a dual significance. The sacrament brings comfort and peace to those who are ill and it is meant as a spiritual preparation for death...passing from this life to the next life or eternal life with God.
