Anointing of The Sick, cont'd

The Anointing of The Sick is one of the seven sacraments. As we know the sacraments are only administered by a priest or a bishop, who is also a priest. Never, Never, Never can the anointing of the sick be administered by a lay person!! Ever!! Those Catholics who instruct a nurse or a doctor to do so are leading the patient astray and the nurse or the doctor or another lay person astray. Why? Because within the anointing the priest is given the authority to forgive sins in the Name of Jesus Christ by virtue of his ordination.

Incidentally, Roman Catholic Deacons can do everything a priest can do, sacramentally, except several things: they cannot offer Mass; they cannot hear confessions and they cannot anoint the sick.

Also, the protestant minister cannot administer the anointing, as most Protestants have only two sacraments and the Anointing is not one of them. If you are a Catholic, a priest is to be called to administer the anointing of the sick. If anyone else but a priest administers this sacrament it is invalid. In other words, the person has not been anointed and will die without the grace of the sacrament.

We must be "on guard" that we do not see the sacraments as something <u>magic</u>. They are spiritual and involve a deep dwelling of Our Lord Jesus and the working of the Holy Spirit in us. For the Lord always seeks to bring us comfort and healing of body and soul.

Holy Day of Obligation All Saints Day November 1st

November 1st is commemorated as <u>All Saints Day</u>. It is a Holy Day of Obligation. Catholics treat Holy Days of Obligation as Sundays and are required to attend Mass on these days. Holy Days require our presence at Mass. It is never the practice of staying home and reading Scriptures of the day. We are not isolationists, but come together as "church" to worship as we do on Sundays. Masses for All Saints Day, Wednesday, November 1, 2023 are as follows: 12:10 pm and 6:00 pm at Saint Catherine Church.

All Souls Day-November 2nd

November 2nd the Catholic Church commemorates as All Souls Day. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation!! Mass will be offered at 9:00 am only on that day. Candle Lighting ceremonies this year will be at the 10:30 Mass on Sunday, November 5, 2023. This is the day we light a candle in memory of those who passed from November 2, 2022 and November 2, 2023. Parishioners are invited to take their loved one's candle home or leave it in Church.

The Book of Remembrance is strictly for recording those who have died, not those who are ill. Mass will be offered for them each day of the week during the month of November.
