

On Going Eucharistic Revival 2022-2025 "St. Marianne Cope 1838-1918"

Each month during the three-year Eucharistic Revival 2022-2025, the Eucharist Congress focuses in on a particular saint. The Saint for May of 2024 is none other than our patron, <u>Saint Marianne Cope</u>.

Born in 1838 in Germany, her baptismal name was "Barbara." Her convent name was "Marianne." Her faith was very centered on Jesus and the Holy Eucharist. After the death of her father in 1862, she entered the Franciscan Sisters in Syracuse, N.Y. She was a teacher and principal of various Catholic Schools. She was instrumental in founding two Catholic hospitals in central New York She was a pioneer of hygiene and sanitation in hospital work, which still influences all hospitals today.

In 1883, she and five Sisters arrived in Hawaii to tend to those suffering from Leprosy (Hansen's disease). Confidence in her work among the lepers flowed from her love for Jesus in the Holy Eucharist.

The boys and girls with leprosy often watched Mother Marianne as she prayed to our Blessed Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. She instituted this Eucharistic practice from eight in the morning until four in the afternoon. The girls and boys knelt before the Blessed Sacrament in prayer. They changed off every half hour.

When we have been nourished with the Body and Blood of the One who gave His life for us, pouring Himself out for our salvation, we are naturally drawn to do the same in service of our brothers and sisters. *This is the key to St. Marianne Cope's holiness*. She was a woman totally in love with Our Blessed Lord, Jesus. She gave herself completely to helping the sick and dying. We are humbly proud that St. Marianne Cope is the Eucharistic model for May 2024.

Some additional information on the Sacrament of Marriage

Many people ask if a permanent Deacon can remarry after the loss of his wife. The answer is **NO**. He may live out his life serving as a Deacon. If he is called to become a priest, after a certain amount of time, he may apply to enter the seminary. According to Cannon Law, a man has to reach the age of 35 to begin the process of ordination to the Deaconate. If a man is not married on the day of ordination, he may not marry at all.

In the Orthodox Church, priests are usually married. If a man seeks ordination to the priesthood and <u>IS NOT</u> married, after ordination to the priesthood, he <u>may not</u> marry. He will then have the opportunity to become a Bishop. Most Orthodox bishops are not married. If the Orthodox priest is married at the time of his Ordination, and his wife dies, the Orthodox priest <u>may not</u> marry again.

The Church upholds the celibacy regulation for the benefit of giving service to the people of God with full attention.

Confirmation Continued

In last week's bulletin I wrote about Confirmation. I wrote that I was going to finish the Sacrament of Confirmation in this week's bulletin. Last week, I mentioned the gifts of the Holy Spirit. There are 7 (seven). Today I share with you the fruits of the Holy Spirit. There are nine. They are as follows: joy, love, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and selfcontrol. (Galatians 5:22) Most Christian Churches do not regard Confirmation as a "sacrament." However, the Roman Catholic Church, the Orthodox Church, the Anglican Church (Church of England not Episcopal) and the Polish National Catholic Church do regard Confirmation as a "sacrament."

The Rite of Confirmation in the Orthodox Church is different from the other Congregations. The Orthodox are confirmed as babies during Baptism. When the Orthodox baby is baptized, he/she receives all three sacraments of initiation: baptism, communion, confirmation at once.
