

The Feast of The Assumption of Mary August 15th

The Assumption of Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation, occurs this year on Thursday, August 15th. In May we celebrated the Ascension of Jesus, forty days after Easter, Jesus "ascends" back to the Father on His own. Mary, on the other hand, having no godly authority or power of her own, is "assumed" into Heaven. Witness the most beautiful painting by Bartolome Esteban-Murillo (1617-1682) of Mary being assumed into Heaven by little cherubs!

As Catholics we believe that after the death of the Virgin Mary, she was not allowed to decay in the grave. She was delivered from original sin in order to give birth to the sinless one.... Jesus Christ, her son. Without any controversy in the Church on this matter for centuries, Pope Pius X11 in 1950, together with the consent of all the bishops the world over, as well as with the consent of the faithful people of God, declared and defined that Mary indeed was assumed into Heaven. It is "de fide" or from the faith of the people in whom the Holy Spirit guides and resides that Mary is truly assumed into Heaven.

The Assumption of Mary into Heaven is the Fourth Mystery in the series of Mysteries of the Rosary called the Glorious Mysteries. Masses on the Feast of The Assumption, Thursday, August 15th will take place at St. Catherine Church. The Mass schedule is as follows: 9am and 12:10 pm. I am eliminating the evening Mass as very few people attend. Holy Days of Obligation are mandatory upon Catholics to celebrate Mass together.

The Sacrament of Holy Orders

Some time ago, I began a series of articles on the seven sacraments. I have already written about the <u>Anointing of The Sick</u>, <u>Matrimony</u>, <u>Confirmation</u> and <u>Baptism</u>. Now, I would like to focus on <u>Holy Orders</u> or ordination to the priest-hood/diaconate.

It is a long tradition in the Roman Catholic, Orthodox and some other Eastern Rite Churches, that only men are ordained for ministry among the faithful.

This is a calling from God, which is very mysterious indeed! Something stirs in the heart, mind and soul of the one being called to public ministry which must be augmented by deep prayer, discernment and spiritual direction.

That spiritual direction is best on the part of a priest, so that the one who is discerning may wish to be reconciled (confession) to God and the priest is readily available to impart absolution in the Name of Jesus Christ.

Concerning the women, I invite you to read the writings and autobiography of St. Therese of Lisieux (1873 – 1897) who so beautifully felt called to priesthood. Her deep faith is incomparable! Her understanding of her mission in the church is exquisite! Her love for priests is yet inexhaustible! Of course, she was a Carmelite: the most profound spirituality in the Church!

Every priest comes from the pews. Every deacon comes from the pews. We are one of you!! I worshipped in the pews for 37 years of my life. That's longer than I've been in Holy Orders. Then, it is good to return to the pews as priest or deacon from whence we came. Return to the pews to pray; to listen to sermons(homilies); to pray the Rosary or the Divine Mercy Chaplet with the people, etc., etc.

When one feels the Lord stirring the heart to be called to lead the people in prayer, one seeks, not only spiritual guidance, but also to enter a "seminary". The word "seminary" comes from the Latin word: "seminus" which means "seed." Thus, Jesus plants the seed in the heart; we enter the seminary so that the seed may grow. It takes 8 years to become a priest. It takes 8 years to become a medical doctor, too.

The studies are very intense with a lot of reading, writing, researching, while still discerning one's vocation. Priests are not stupid! They are well educated to be able to handle most of the ups and downs of their parishioners and society. To accompany the academics, there is intense spirituality, study of the Bible; its history; its linguistic nuances, etc. Seminarians generally study Latin, Greek and Hebrew (for understanding the scriptures). They may elect to study Spanish, French, or Italian and sometimes German. With all this, seminarians go on "apostolates" or ministries among the sick and dying. They teach C.C.D. (Faith Formation) for various churches in the area. On top of all this, the seminarian takes psychological courses to understand himself and the various personality types he will serve.
