

The Saint Michael Prayer & the vision of Pope Leo X111 (1878-1903)

It is reported that during Mass in 1886 Pope Leo XIII was given a vision of Satan claiming he will destroy God's Church. Those attending Mass witnessed the pope becoming very pale with a look of tremendous fright on his face. After telling those close to him of the vision, he penned the St. Michael prayer and had it prayed only after the Low Mass. Recall that before Vatican II (1962 - 1965) there was a "Low Mass" and a "High Mass." The High Mass was all sung by a choir. The Low Mass was not sung, at all. Here is the <u>original prayer</u> in honor of St. Michael by Pope Leo XIII:

" O Glorious Archangel, St. Michael Prince of the Heavenly Host, be our defense in the terrible warfare which we carry on against principalities and powers, against the rulers of this world of darkness, spirits of evil." Amen

Below is the modified prayer in honor of St. Michael:

St. Michael, the Archangel. defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil; may God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou O prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, thrust into Hell, Satan and all the evil Spirits who wander (prowl) through the world for the ruin of souls." Amen

Thursday Night Rosary

Every Thursday evening, beginning on September 12, 2024 at 6:00PM, <u>St. Mary's 42</u> <u>Spring St. Windsor Locks, CT</u> the rosary will be offered to seek the Blessed Mother's intercession in praying for the 2024 election of a pro-life President who will protect the sacredness of life from conception to natural death and defend religious freedom.

<u>Feast of St. Michael.</u> <u>The Archangel, September 29th</u>

This is one of those Feast Days I mentioned in previous articles that falls on a Sunday and because it is the Lord's Day it isn't celebrated this year. However, it is an important day in the Church calendar that I decided to write about it.

Actually, this day would have been celebrated as the Feast of the Archangels, Michael, Gabriel and Raphael. In the pre-Vatican 11 calendar, each of these Archangels had their own day: Michael, September 29; Gabriel, March 24, and Raphael, October 21. The celebration of these Archangels has been celebrated by the Church since 745 A.D. when it was approved by the Lateran Council.

Incidentally, there have been five Lateran Councils. As stated before, the Fourth Lateran Council in 1215 A.D. gave us the seven sacraments. Please recall, that the Lateran Basilica is the pope's Cathedral as the Archbishop of Rome. The name "Michael" means: <u>who is like God.</u> The name "Gabriel" means: <u>Power of God</u> and the name "Raphael" means: <u>God has healed</u>.

In the Mass prayers for this day these Archangels are referred to as the "Princes of The Angels". They are protective and watch over the faithful. In heaven they who serve God constantly, keep our life safe from harm on earth. Pope St. Gregory, The Great (590-604) writes that they have a special function of protecting us. This is attributed, he writes, to Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, most especially.

Of course, the angels and Archangels are definitely associated with Divine Worship (Mass). In the seminary we were taught that the angels are present during the celebration of the Mass. Please witness this in Eucharistic Prayer I ... "we pray that your angel may take this sacrifice to your altar in Heaven."

Would we have celebrated this Feast today, the importance of it is that the angels ceaselessly sing: Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Hosts; Heaven and earth are filled with your glory!" When we sing this at Mass we join them for that moment. We are one with them and the liturgy taking place in Heaven. Here are the words of Jesus in John 1:5, "I solemnly assure you, you shall see the sky opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael, Pray For Us

<u>October 2™</u> _<u>Feast of the Guardían Angels</u>

Of course, Mass will be celebrated at 12:10pm on the Feast of the Guardian Angels, October 2^{nd} . This was first celebrated in Valencia, Spain in 1411 A.D. Pope Sixtus V (1585-1590) in the year 1590 granted a special Mass in honor of the Guardian Angels. Since the year 1608, the Guardian Angels have been celebrated on October 2^{nd} , placed in the Roman (Catholic) Calendar by Pope Paul V (1605-1621). The Angels eternally sing the praises of the Lord. Please join us for Mass on October 2^{nd} .

<u>St. Joseph Cathedral</u> October 14, 2024

On Monday, October 14, 2024, our new Archbishop, Christopher Coyne will be invested with the **Pallium** from Archbishop Christophe Pierre the Apostolic Nuncio to the United States. The Nuncio is the Pope's Vatican Representative to our country.

Archbishop Coyne already received the Pallium from Pope Francis in Rome on June 29, 2024, the Feast Day of Saints Peter and Paul. He will now be invested with it in our Cathedral so that all of us may attend.

There is a sign up sheet at both parishes for those interested in attending the Mass and reception on this important day for us and Archbishop Coyne. At no charge to you a bus will be provided to take us there and bring us back. More details to follow. Please sign your name and phone number on the sheet. We ask you to <u>PRINT</u> your first and last name.

As mentioned before, the <u>Pallium</u> is placed around the neck and shoulders of an archbishop. Most archbishops are Metropolitans, meaning that they have jurisdiction over several dioceses. Our Archbishop is the Metropolitan of Hartford, Bridgeport, Norwich and Providence. Presently, as Metropolitan, Archbishop Coyne is the administrator of the Diocese of Norwich, a new bishop is appointed.

The office will be <u>closed</u> on October 14, 2024. I am humbly expecting a generous turn-out of parishioners on that day of great celebration in honor of our Archbishop. September 29, 2024
